St. John ECG Monitor Presentation at Bridgwater

Following the very generous response to the PGM's appeal by all the Mark and Royal Ark Mariner Lodges in the Province our Provincial Grand Master, David Nelson, presented a *heart-Defibrillator-Monitor* and accessories to St John Ambulance, which in turn will turn their Crusader Ambulance into a Paramedic vehicle.

The handover took place at the organisation's local HQ at St John House, Woodland Business Park, Bristol Road, Bridgwater on Thursday 3rd March last. This presentation marked the conclusion of a very successful appeal to raise £20,000 for *Hearing Dogs for Deaf People* and *St John Ambulance*. The

Provincial Grand Master accompanied by Mrs Catherine Nelson was supported by thirty five brethren representing every Mark and Royal Ark Mariner Lodge in the Province.

David commented "All the Lodges in our wonderful Province have responded brilliantly to my appeal. Their generosity demonstrates quite clearly that Mark Masons care about others and that they are very happy to make a significant contribution to their local



community, I am very proud of them all "

The equipment can accurately diagnose that a heart attack has or is being suffered by the patient and which area of the heart is in trouble. This information is then printed onto a paper roll and accompanies the patient to hospital allowing that patient to bypass the A&E department and get immediate treatment. The unit was expertly demonstrated to all present by Will Newton, the County Ambulance Officer

It may well be remembered that in the year 2000 on a particularly sunny

afternoon in the City of Wells and following Evensong at the Cathedral, the Mark Master Masons of Somerset, headed by the then Provincial Grand Master Tony Hick, presented a new Crusader Ambulance to St. John, City of Wells Division. The ambulance was part of a donation of 40 such vehicles donated by the Mark Benevolent Fund throughout England; the gift was valued in excess of £2million.


